Youngmin Lee demos Bojagi at FAA

The gallery was very privileged to have Youngmin Lee speak on the art of Korean stitching at the February general meeting. Around 35 people, members and nonmembers, attended to learn about this traditional art form. Youngmin Lee has presented at the Asian Art Museum and other venues around the Bay Area.

Bojagi, the art of Korean wrapping cloths, embodies the philosophy of recycling, as the cloths are made from remnants of leftover fabric. Bojagi can be described as a true form of abstract expressionism.

Our own Allison demonstrated how she paints organic materials in an abstract way at the general meeting in March. Most of her inspiration comes from objects found in her garden such as flowers, fruits, plants, tree branches, and even shadows. She showed how to combine various reference materials and impose new colors, textures, and forms to create an abstraction of those objects. Color theory and various paint application techniques were covered. Members learned about how to add more freedom and fun into their creative process. Allison often find herself allowing the paint to make some of the decisions. The creative process is the most important component in her art because she enjoys the way paint behaves before it solidifies.

Allison King is a Bay Area-based artist who received a BFA in Traditional Art and a BA in Liberal Studies at CSU, East Bay. She enjoys creating both representational and nonrepresentational art. Her work is primarily process driven, focusing on nature and people. She will be offering classes at the gallery starting Mar 31.

Are travel plans in your future? Want to enrich your travel experiences and combine your travels with your artistic endeavors? Then you will want to attend "The Art of Travel Sketching" demonstration by featured artist, David Savellano.

David's demonstration will review the ins and outs of the plein air sketching experience, and basic techniques of ink and watercolor sketches. He will discuss the key questions to ask yourself before you put ink or a brush to paper. Over the years, David has developed a quick, fresh, loose watercolor style which lends itself well to the time constraints of traveling. He is eager to share his personal knowledge gained after self study, weekly life drawing and numerous watercolor and drawing classes and workshops.

Draw and paint-along during the demonstration. Audience participation is encouraged; so bring a sketchbook, permanent black sketch or ink pen, brush and a small travel set of watercolors. Come to the meeting early, a limited number of seats will be set up in our meeting room and made available on a first come, first serve basis.

Peggy Kirk, Painting with a Knife Wed., Jun. 5, 1pm



Unwrap the mystery of using a knife.

Learn how to render objects in water mixable oils with only a palette knife. We'll start the demo with a simple object rendered in three or four values. Then I'll show how easy it is to create buildings with a knife. The knife is especially adept at rendering old barns. We'll also render trees using a long knife. Trees, es-

pecially tall straight aspen, are also easy to create using a long knife. Finally we'll load the knife with multiple colors and move it across a surface to create water reflections.
